Welcome to our new staff starting term 2

Nau mai haere mai. Welcome to term two. I hope you all enjoyed the holiday break and are refreshed and ready for another busy term.

On Monday we welcomed two new kaiako to the teaching team at MMI. Whaea Ana Hokopaura-Whelan is now the proud teacher of whanau 6. Ana is a mountie from way back. She went to MMI as a student herself and in fact has returned to her own classroom, this time as the teacher. Ana is an experienced year 7 and 8 teacher with a passion for tikanga and Te Reo Maori. In whanau 4, the new teacher is Quintin Moolman. Quintin and his whanau have moved to Papamoa from Wellington, where they had lived for three years, after immigrating from South Africa. Mr Moolman is a keen runner and word on the street is that he can beat Mr Banbury up the mount. In our office, the new face belongs to Mel McDonald. Mel joins us from the Tauranga Art Gallery and has made a great start in her new role in our busy office. If you see any of our new staff around this week, stop and say hello.

This term, we are learning about the Arts; how different groups of people express themselves in creative ways. There will be lots of opportunities for students to enjoy the creative arts as well as to view performances and learn about various art forms.

Achievement Data

Last terms focus on number in Mathematics saw some pleasing results, especially given the attendance disruptions due to COVID. It was great to see accelerated progress being made across the school, with all classes making positive shifts from the beginning to the end of term assessment. Number underpins all strands of Maths. Being able to add, subtract, multiply and divide is pivotal to the understanding of many mathematical concepts. At years 7 and 8, students should be able to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions and decimals. They should be able to apply the times tables to large numbers and have a sound understanding of place value. Calculating percentages is also a skill taught at level four. If your child cannot recall the times tables quickly and accurately, we encourage you to practice this with them. Practicing working our percentage discounts at the shops is also a great thing to do with your child to help them with the number aspect of Maths.

Vaping

Unfortunately, we have had a few cases of vaping at school in recent weeks. Vaping is both harmful for young people and illegal. As a school, we will not tolerate students bringing vapes to school and if students are caught vaping, they will face serious consequences. Please support us by talking to your child about the dangers of vaping. Encourage them to be strong in the face of peer pressure and to refrain from starting a habit that is unhealthy, expensive and illegal. If your child does have access to a vape, please ensure that they do not bring it to school. We appreciate your support in this regard.

Wearing our Uniform

Wearing the MMI uniform in public means that our students are representing our school when they are out and about. It's important that students remember that when they are out in public, they are easily identifiable as belonging to our kura. Sadly, we have had a small number of students shoplifting before and after school. As well as reflecting badly on the individuals involved, shop lifting in our uniform also reflects badly on our school. Please talk to your children about doing the right thing. Taking goods from local businesses is not OK and I'm sure that all parents and whanau agree that engaging in theft is not a good idea.

AIMS Games

AIMS Games trials are starting this term. As always, MMI will enter teams and individuals in many of the more than 20 codes that make up the Zespri AIMS Games. If your child is keen to participate in the games, please remind them to listen out to the daily notices for important information about days and times for trials. MT MAUNGANUI KĀHUI AKO -LEARNING SUPPORT UPDATE MAY 2022

Within our kāhui ako (community of schools) we work together to implement the Ministry of Education's <u>Learning Support Delivery Model (LDSM)</u>. This involves our Special Educational Need Coordinators (SENCo's) working collaboratively to ensure a common language and shared understanding of how to address and meet the needs of diverse learners within our community.

School SENCo's meet regularly to share <u>aggregate data</u> and plan how to utilise resources and expertise to address learning support needs. This process allows us to identify trends and gaps and to deliver appropriate services and programmes accessible for schools, students and whanau. We gather information via a Learning Support Register and data gathered across the kāhui ako has enabled us to access additional support, such as DHB funding to employ a full time Mental Health Clinician to work with students in Years o-8. A Learning Support Panel (made up of the Ministry of Education, Resource Teachers of Learning and Behaviour (RTLB), DHB representatives and other community agencies and services) meets regularly to further identify and address needs and to support the kāhui ako in implementing the LSDM. Members of the Learning Support Panel work with teachers and whanau on ways to help create responsive and inclusive environments for students with diverse learning needs.
