There is a boundary fence around the site and it has been pleasing to see students staying away from the builders so that they can get their work done.




Positive Culture for Learning (PC4L)

Last week, I shared our Positive Culture for Learning (PC4L) data with you. This week, I thought I'd explain a little more about how we manage students' behaviour in all our classrooms.

Our Coastal Values of Respect, Pride and Learning underpin all that we do at MMI and also how we expect students to conduct themselves. All teachers endeavour to manage student's behaviour through strong relationships and clear communication. PC4L lessons are taught regularly in classrooms. Students are taught our expectations and reminded of them regularly, rather than being expected to just know them. Classroom teachers use praise regularly to encourage positive and appropriate behaviour. Many run reward systems that encourage teamwork and positive classroom culture.

When students make poor choices about their behaviour, the process for dealing with that is displayed in every room and is known as our "Majors and Minors Chart". This document outlines the process for dealing with poor behaviour clearly. For minor behaviours, if students have ignored the warnings and redirection from a teacher, they will be asked to move to a buddy class and complete a "think sheet". The think sheet is a reflective tool where the student identifies what went wrong, who was impacted and what they will do to make the situation right. Think sheets come home to be signed by parents and teachers will make contact with you as parents to discuss the issue. They are also logged on our student management system so that we can track behaviour across all school settings.



For major behaviours, the process is different. Students are fast tracked to the Senior Leadership Team. This almost always involves some kind of investigation. If appropriate, witnesses are spoken with, and incident reports written by staff and students involved. Parents are always contacted and clear communication is given regarding consequences and future actions to reinstate the student in class.

As a school, we value restorative practices when things have gone wrong between students. This is always facilitated in a professional, safe way with all students being well supported through the process.

As a school, we know that things go wrong from time to time. Our staff is committed to supporting students to behave well and to support those who are in some way harmed by others. Safety is of huge importance to us at MMI.

Social Media

In recent weeks, far too much of our time has been taken up unpicking issues originating from poor behaviour on social media. In the spotlight this week has been an Instagram account that someone has set up that encourages MMI students to post rumours about fellow students. We have reported this account to Instagram and asked several students who have been impacted by this account to delete it.

Social media has a huge pull over emerging adolescents. Good kids make dumb choices far too often about what they post. And far too many students see things that they should not see on platforms like Instagram and TikTok.

PLEASE support us by monitoring your child's use of social media. If they are being treated poorly online, report it to Netsafe or if necessary to the Police and ensure that they delete harmful contacts. Limit your child's time on a device and always do spot checks about what they are seeing and doing. As parents of children this is your right. Keeping your child safe online is a challenge in this world.


