Due to the disastrous weather early in the week, the delivery of our modular classrooms has been slightly delayed. We are waiting for a confirmed date for delivery, but it should be in the next few days.

It was good to hear that the Government has overturned its initial decision to prevent international students enrolling in New Zealand primary and intermediate schools. At MMI, we have always enjoyed the flavour that students from other countries bring to our school. In September this year, I will travel to Korea to market for international students for the 2023 school year. Visiting Korea is always a fantastic experience and I very much look forward to reconnecting with some of our past students and seeing how they have grown and developed back in their home country.

As you are aware, this week is a short week for students as Friday is a Mount Maunganui Kahui Ako teachers only day. On Friday, our staff will work with teachers from all of our contributing schools, as well as Mount Maunganui College, to moderate our assessment processes in mathematics. Working with teachers from all Mount schools to establish shared and agreed understanding of the NZ Curriculum and how to measure it, is great for student's learning. Building consistency across our schools means that transitions between schools are smooth and that shared academic data is accurate. It's great to be part of a cohesive and collaborative Kahui Ako and I know our staff appreciate the time they will have on Friday to work with their colleagues from other kura. Thank you to our MMI for whanau for supporting us by keeping your children at home for an extra-long weekend.

On that note, enjoy the winter break this weekend. I hope you all enjoy some extended family time and we look forward to seeing you back next Tuesday for another short week.

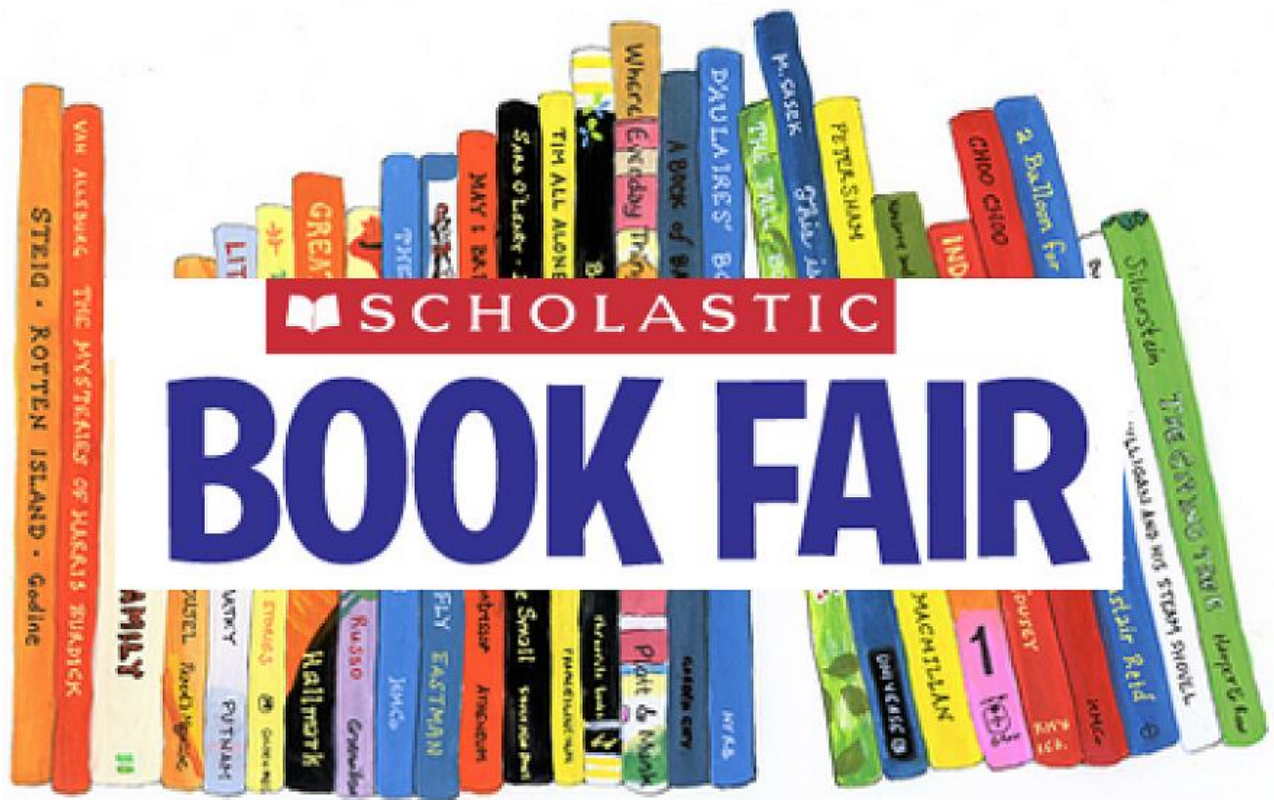
COASTAL VALUE CERTIFICATES 2022
