During the school holidays myself, Sam Cameron, Poppy and Charlie Richardson travelled to Lake Karapiro to compete in the three-day National Canoe Sprint Championships with our club, Bay of Plenty Paddle Sports.

All season long, since the end of term two, 2021, we have been working hard training on the Wairoa River for this moment and the opportunity to compete against the best paddlers from all over the country. We did K1, K2 and K4 over distances of 100m, 200m and 500m. Sam Cameron, Charlie Richardson, our teammate and I did a K4 for the first time ever and ended up 5th in the 12 & under mixed. I also got to compete in the 14 & under K2 with Poppy as she was in the older age group.

In the 12 & under mixed K2 my teammate and I won Gold in the 200m in a very close and exciting race. It felt amazing to be the best K2 crew in NZ. Sam and Charlie also made it into the final which was an awesome result for our club to have 2 crews in the final. In the 12 & under Girls K1 500m I got Silver and in the K1 200m I also got Silver. Overall, I had an amazing experience racing and hanging out with my teammates. We all did so well for our first ever competition.

It was awesome to be able to paddle on the same course as our incredible Olympic athletes and even have professional TV commentators calling our races. My highlight of the whole experience was probably getting my medals presented by Olympians Lisa Carrington and Caitlin Regal and getting to watch Lisa and Amy Fischer battle it out for a place at the world champs. They are amazing athletes. Can't wait to get back on the river and start working towards next year with the rest of the team.

Entry for these tests is optional and open to all students at Mount Maunganui Intermediate. However, there is a cost for each test of \$20.70 which needs to be paid by parents when they register.

Registrations close on the 1st August 2022.

The ICAS assessments offered online for 2022 are Writing, Digital Technologies, English, Science, Spelling and Mathematics. Students can complete as many of these tests as they wish.

ICAS tests are sat by thousands of students throughout New Zealand, Australia and other Pacific nations. The testing process is administered from Australia and will be completed online.



MATARIKI NATIVE PLANTING ON MAUAO

Morning of June 24th (Matariki Public Holiday)

PiPS would love you to join us! This is a little different to traditional plantings, as tamariki grew these natives at our local schools from seed collected off Mauao over a year ago as part of the PiPS Mauao Regeneration Project! Local iwi have set aside a special site for planting, in what we have named the "PiPS Whanau Ngahere", a place you can visit for years to come - very special!

As part of Matariki Ki Mauao 2022 and our re-planting will take place after the opening of the ātea a rangi (a celestial star compass) at the top of Mauao. This special



Golf Road signalised crossing



Signalised crossing installation - Golf Road

The existing zebra crossing near the Golf Road/Links Avenue intersection will be replaced with a signalised crossing in July to improve safety. The new crossing will be straight across, without the pedestrian refuge in the centre of the road and will have a raised table to slow approaching traffic. It will have segregated halves so that cyclists and pedestrians are separated and there will also be countdown timers.

Works are expected to take up to four weeks and will include the July school holidays to minimise disruption.

A temporary crossing will be installed further down the road whilst construction is happening.


