

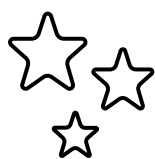

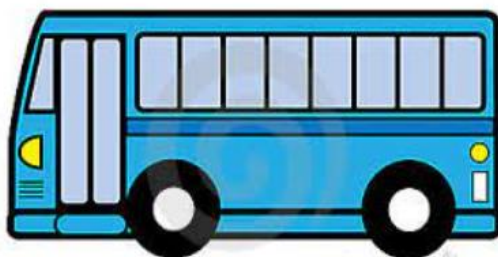

Kia ora Parents and Whanau

Welcome to week three. I hope you all survived the storm last weekend.

This week we are holding our school Try-athlon. This is a great opportunity for students to get involved and earn points for their house. It is always a fun event and it's great to see the house spirit developing as students both participate and cheer on their fellow house competitors. We will share some photos of the event with you in due course.

Camps

Thank you to the parents who have offered us positive feedback about our 2022 camp. As you are aware, COVID restrictions have made planning EOTC events significantly more challenging and we are doing our best to continue to offer our students events they can enjoy outside of the classroom.

Our camp (3 day excursions) for 2022 aligns strongly with our term one inquiry about local history. The students will visit many places of significance during their three days and the excursions we have planned are a good mix of learning activities with some adventure opportunities as well. There are strong links to the classroom programmes and the students will use their experiences on 'camp' to make links to their learning in the classroom.

Our long term plan for camps is to alternate a curriculum based camp (as is the case this year), with an adventure based camp at Ngatuhua Lodge the following year (2023). This way, in their two years with us, students will experience both. We are hopeful that camp at Ngatuhua can go ahead next year under alert level settings. Whilst we know that not offering the overnight experience at camp this year is disappointing for some, we simply could not see how we could follow COVID restriction requirements at the Marae where large groups of students would be sleeping in one room.

We appreciate those who are supporting the school by making the voluntary camp payment. Whilst the Board of Trustees allows some money from the operations grant to cover camp costs, camps simply will not go ahead in the future if our community doesn't financially support them.

Several classes have visited Pukehinahina this week, as part of term one's learning. Matua Tapuraka has accompanied each class to speak with the children about what happened on this historic site in Tauranga Moana. Thank you to the parents who have assisted us with transport.

On crossing duty this morning, I greeted many students as they arrived at school. I was pleased to see them using the correct entry points on Links Ave, avoiding the car park. I also noted the high standards of uniform on everyone and enjoyed their friendly greetings as they arrived at school. Keep up the good work Mounties :-)

We are so excited to tell you about our Camp for 2022, which is tied into our term one inquiry about the local history of Tauranga Moana.

Covid presented a challenge for planning this year's camps. As we wanted to ensure equity for all students at MMI, we have deliberately selected experiences where we can be inclusive of all our students, regardless of their vaccination status. This means that every child at MMI has access to camp. We have booked entire venues, so the venue will essentially be our kura for the day. However, any adults who help out on the day will be required to be fully vaccinated.

Given the restrictions under the “red” level, we have decided that overnight stays are not wise in the current climate. Instead, so that our students do not miss out, we have been busy planning several exciting experiences for your child to enjoy as a three day, daytime camp.

Each class will be involved in several EOTC learning experiences which will take place over 3 fun-filled days.

THESE EXPERIENCES ARE:

- 1. Stand-up Paddleboarding, Waka Ama and a guided walk to understand the cultural significance and History of Mauao.**
- 2. Visiting Tahuwhakatiki Marae for powhiri and cultural activities.**
- 3. Adrenaline Forrest and a cruise in the harbour on “The Kewpie”.**

Part of the fun of the camp experience is sharing meals with your classmates. The cost of the camp is inclusive of lunch each day.

Your child will be involved in these learning experiences between weeks 5 and 10 of term one.

The voluntary cost of these camp activities is \$120 per child. Please pay this into account number: **12-3146-0104711-03**. Please use your child's initial and surname as the code and “camp” as the reference. Cash, credit card and EFTPOS are also accepted at the office.

Last year, the majority of families paid the camp donation which gave us confidence to go ahead and plan camps for this year. We are sincerely hoping that as many families will make the voluntary camp donation in 2022. We may not be able to sustain the EOTC/School Camp programme in the future if we do not receive your support, to cover costs.

Your child's teacher will be sending out detailed information specific to their classroom shortly. Keep an eye on your emails so that you are fully informed about dates and the opportunity to join us on our three-day excursion as a camp parent.

EDGE APP FOR CAREGIVERS

The Edge app gives you access to view your child's data including (but not limited to) Attendance and Financial details. You cannot pay school bills through this app. You can make payments via internet banking to our bank account 12-3146-0104711-03 using your child's name as ref and what you are paying for as the code. Cash, EFTPOS and credit cards are accepted at the school office.

Logging into the Edge App is quick and easy with just a few steps required to get you underway.

Download the app for your device. It is available for both Apple and Android devices and can be downloaded from the relevant stores.

To add the Edge App to an iPad, search and download the Edge App under iPhone, not tablet. There may be a filter to select> Supports> and select iPad only.

Once you have downloaded and installed the app, the first thing you will need to do is set up your PIN. You will need to enter your PIN twice to confirm it.

Once you have done so, you will be presented with the login screen.

If you have set your school account up with Gmail, you can use the G+ authenticator to log in. If not, enter the email address you have provided to MMIS.

You can then use the 'Reset Edge password'. This will email you a link to set up your password. Follow those instructions to set it up, then return to the app.

These steps will only have to be done the first time you log in. If you use the Log Out function in the app you will need to repeat the above steps.

Once you have logged in, you will be presented with your Dashboard, and from here you can view your child's data. The settings menu can be found in the top right corner. From there you can change your PIN, view your profile etc, as well as log out of the Edge account (only necessary if you have multiple Edge accounts).

TOI - WEARABLE ARTS - 29 JUNE 2022

This year we have another fantastic opportunity to enter Toi, the Wearable Art competition run in collaboration with World of Wearable Arts.

In 2021 there were over 225 entries nationwide and Dame Suzie Moncrieff and Heather Palmer were blown away by the technical skills and creative thinking. A real highlight of this Toi experience is the photoshoot and wearable art showcase on stage at Trustpower Arena.

HOW IT WORKS:

- Showquest's Wearable Art competition introduces students nationwide to the concept and is a platform to develop our homegrown talent from a young age. Students work **solo** or in collaborative groups of **up to five** to create a wearable art garment inspired by one of our five design briefs.
- You must submit a garment title and written description explaining your creative interpretation of your chosen brief.
- Students exhibit their creation at a Showquest event, where it will be worn onstage by the designer or their chosen student model. These events combine our Showquest stage shows and Toi showcase and are an exciting night of celebration with whānau and friends.
- On event day we will rehearse the stage section and set up a photoshoot backstage - where we will take professional photographs of the garment to be used for national judging by our WOW judges. Toi has two competing sections: **Junior (Y1-8)** and **Senior (Y9-13)**.

2022 DESIGN BRIEFS

These design briefs have been created in collaboration with WOW to give students a taste for the WOW experience through Toi. Choose to be inspired by one of the four briefs, or come up with something weird, wonderful and utterly unique in Open.

Myths, Legends and Fantastic Beasts

Since the dawn of time, humans from all cultures have passed stories down through generations. These stories became folklore, telling legends of creatures in the depths of the oceans, Gods atop mountains and mystical beings. Bring us garments inspired by myths, legends and fantastic beasts - whether the stuff of fairytales, nightmares, fantasy worlds or your weirdest, wildest imagination.

Stories of the South Pacific

Great wearable art tells a story, and we want to see creations that celebrate the rich culture, history and traditions of the South Pacific. In your mind's eye, journey from Aotearoa, Land of the Long White Cloud, across the Pacific to our island neighbours and friends. Think about the oceans and skies between us; what flora and fauna make it their home? Explore the world of Māori and Pasifika culture, language and taonga to make a special and considered piece of wearable art.

Larger than Life

What you see is not always what you get. Challenge our first impressions by creating a wearable art masterpiece that transforms, opens or changes onstage. Does it unfurl a cape? Hoist up feathered wings? Turn inside out? Reveal a hidden message? Take inspiration from fashion, art, nature, architecture and design. Think about bold colours, inventive materials and construction techniques. Be experimental, use the element of surprise and make us say WOW!

City of the Future

The year is 2122. Or is it 4022? The choice is yours, and you are the architect of the City of the Future. Flashing lights, gleaming metals and high-tech inventions reign supreme. Where in the world is your city? Or have you set up a new civilisation at a space station run by robots or on a far-off planet? Take inspiration from sculptures, engineering and architecture and show us the futuristic cityscape of your imagination.

Open

Do you march to the beat of your own drum? In this section the choice of what to make is yours - there are no rules! Dare to dream big and create with no boundaries. Think about telling a story through wearable art, and make considered choices in materials, design and construction to give voice to your message. Show us what Toi means to you!

COST

Toi has an entry cost of **\$10 per student**, to a maximum of \$50 (5 students) per entry. This entry fee allows us to create resources for entrants, provide prize packages, take your professional photos and create our Showquest/Toi events at a world-class venue for students to showcase their garments onstage.

What will the judges be looking for?

- **Concept** – Does the garment meet the design brief? The garment must be a complete head to toe concept and clearly portray the designer's interpretation of the theme.
- **Originality and Innovation** – Have you pushed your creative boundaries? The judges are looking for a garment that will surprise them and demonstrate design from a fresh perspective. They want to see exploration of an idea/concept and a unique approach in terms of materials and design techniques.
- **Quality of Construction** – Is your garment well-made and securely constructed? Your garment should look as good up close, as it does from a distance. The judges will be looking for neat, tidy finishing of all components. Garments may be worn multiple times and need to accommodate easy movement as well as being strong enough to cope with choreography.
- **Health and Safety** – Is your garment safe for a model to wear and move in? The judges will consider whether a garment is safe; they will look at things like visibility, breathability, weight distribution and footwear.

Showquest 2022 - Covid-19 Protection Framework plan

Key points - Under all traffic light settings, all students, teachers, whānau, audience members and showquest/venue crew over the age of 12 years, 3 months will be required to present their My Vaccine Pass to gain entry to all showquest venues. These important safety measures are a venue and event industry mandate as instructed by the New Zealand Government. Everyone on site will be required to scan in, show their vaccine pass and wear a mask throughout the day. Performers can remove masks when onstage for rehearsals and final performances.

We will confirm finalised plans for Showquest/Toi - ie whether we will be going ahead with the Green/Orange or Red plan by Monday 21 March.

Schools will then have until Friday 25 March to confirm their involvement, at which point we will invoice for your \$10 per student entry fee.

At the heart of the World of Wearable Art (WOW) is an unwavering commitment to creativity and giving designers the opportunity to see their works of wearable art presented and profiled in the most extraordinary of ways.

We need your inspiration so it is with great excitement that we would love you to give wearable art a go and bring us imaginative, eye-catching works of wearable art that tell a story. We look forward to seeing what you can create for the Toi wearable art competition in 2022.

If this competition interests you, please let me know as soon as possible. Provide me with a picture of your garment design and the materials you plan to use. I am very happy to work alongside you with both your design and the construction of your garment, however the majority of the work is to be completed at home.
