There is a lot to celebrate about in this data, especially in writing



To be "where they should be" at this stage of the year, **Year 7 students** need to be "At Level 3" or higher. By the end of the year, Year 7's must be at "Early Level 4". For **Year 8 students**, the expectation *now* is "Early Level 4" and at the end of the year, Year 8's must be "At Level 4".

As a staff, we have been focussing on writing as a curriculum area. It is great to see that the hard work our staff have been putting into this area of the curriculum has certainly paid off.

Last term, we focused on essay writing. We taught all of our students about the structural requirements that students are taught in years 9 and 10 at Mount College. All students wrote essays about a character in a novel they had read. I have to say I was extremely impressed with the calibre of writing our students produced.

Earlier this week, Mrs Thurston and I went to Mount College to moderate some of our student's writing with their Head of English, Melissa Flett. Ms Flett was very impressed with the essays our students had written. Ms Flett told us that several of the pieces she saw were at a strong year 9 level, and a few were even meeting expectations for years 10 and 11.

Ms Flett was able to give us some great feedback about what we can do at MMI to prepare our students for success at College. We are so lucky to have such great reciprocal relationships with our College that really set our students up for success when they leave us at the end of year 8.


MMI SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

ICAS tests are sat by thousands of students throughout New Zealand, Australia and other Pacific nations. The testing process is administered from Australia and will be completed online.






