Whānau 23 and whānau 24 moved into their new classrooms yesterday. There were some excited students and teachers as they moved into the lovely, modern new classrooms.

There are three other building projects in the pipeline for our school. Six new rooms are scheduled to replace the "temporary" classrooms on our field. We are working with the architect to make design decisions about these and hope to see them arrive during 2023. The Board of Trustees have decided to use board funds to erect a shade sail over half of the turf. This will allow for an all-weather PE programme as well as provide valuable shade in the hot summer months. Finally, a fence is being built around our perimeter. This is a Ministry funded project and is scheduled to be completed in term four this year.

# Making our learning visible

One of our goals in this unit of inquiry is to make sure our journals reflect our ability and understanding.

We are learning how important it is to **show** our thinking. When we do, our teachers and co-learners can offer valuable feedback and feedforward to help our next steps in learning. We are becoming assessment-capable learners by using SOLO taxonomy to help us work out what level of understanding the task requires of us and whether we meet that criteria or not. We are developing our independence, interdependence and responsibility as we conduct scientific investigations and explore the forms and transformations of energy. We have learned to look closely, listen and record all our observations - scientist's notes need to be specific and detailed.
