MIXED HOCKEY

With 50 teams in the mixed hockey division, the MMI mixed team did not know what to expect at AIMS but knew that they probably needed to win all 5 pool games to make it into top 8 and the quarter finals.

The first 3 games were pretty straight forward with the team scoring 29 goals and not being scored against. It quickly became clear that the 2 remaining pool games against Te Awamutu and Whangarei were going to be much tougher - must wins. The teams defence held tight with tense 3-2 and 1-0 wins to seal a spot in the quarters.

Local, quarter final opponent, Te Puke put up a great fight but in the end Mount comfortably overcame them with a 3-0 win to book a spot in the semis against tournament favourites Hillview, who had scored 58 goals in their first 6 games. It was very exciting and such a cool experience to have the game live streamed and commentated by Glenn Lamar from Sky Sport.

The team played with great defensive fight and produced some very composed hockey, scoring first, but then being unlucky to be tied 1-1 at half time after Hillview had a breakaway goal. At 1-1 halfway through the 2nd half the tense game was anyone's until a couple of brilliant individual plays from Hillview broke the deadlock to see Mount go down and return on finals day to play for bronze against a strong Palmerston North team.

In a very tight medal match with a great crowd cheering on the team from the side-line, Mount produced a fantastic display of their typically strong defence and composed and patient teambased attack for a 2-0 win and the bronze medal. An amazing result for Mount hockey and thoroughly deserved for the team that put everything they had into their games and stuck together and played together as a team right through the tournament.







CANOE SPRINTS

A strong southerly wind from the snow-covered Central Plateau made for an incredibly cold day at Pilot Bay, but that did not deter the MMI Canoe Sprint Team who all showed great strength of character and skill in very challenging conditions, against over 80 other paddlers, from 21 schools.

Each paddler raced in 2 heats with accumulated points determining what tier final they then raced in. Kate and Maia both made it to the B final in year 7 Girls and finished 10th and 11th overall respectively. Ed and Sam made the A final and finished 4th and 5th overall respectively. The year 8 girls A final was set up to be an epic battle with some very strong canoe sprint paddlers including MMI's Poppy and Isla. In a tight, fast race Isla managed to get out in front and hold to take the gold, with Poppy being unlucky to be caught in traffic to finish 4th.

Onto the team relays, with MMI entering a Year 7 Boys team with Sam, Ed and Kate, and a Year 8 girls team with Poppy, Isla and Maia. The Year 7 team had a great paddle to take out the silver and the strong MMI Year 8 girls team dominated their race from start to finish to take out a very comfortable win for the gold.

In very challenging conditions the Mounties showed just how gutsy, tenacious and tough they are and came away with 1 individual and 1 team gold and 1 team silver to make it a very successful day for MMI on the water.

The girls came 9th equal out of 16th, top of the bottom pool and had some amazing results. They came together as a team and displayed great sportsmanship and were praised for that a number of times of how they treated each other and other teams.

The football boys had an awesome week at AIMS doing what they love best...playing lots of football!! They worked well as a team and were really supportive of each other on and off the field.





Attendees will consider other points of view, investigate their characters' stories, and work through a step-by-step guide to awesome, authentic writing.




