Kia ora Parents and Whānau

I hope you all enjoyed Labour weekend and that you were able to make the most of the fantastic spring weather.

Term four is whizzing by as we look to begin the transition to college for our Year 8's as well as beginning the mammoth task of enrolling next year's Year

We have started this term with a PC4L focus of keeping our hands and **feet to ourselves.** Our class councillors have been running class meetings about this and reminding all students that any kind of physical play that involves contact with others, is not permitted at MMI, unless it is a sport being supervised by a teacher. Emerging adolescents often take things one step too far - so play fighting and sparring are not allowed at our school. Your child can expect a think sheet or other consequence if they choose not to keep their hands and feet to themselves.

This term's inquiry has hooked-in our students. Everywhere you go around our kura, there is talk of the environment - the animals that depend on the forests and the pests that put them and the planet in danger. Our classrooms are looking so engaging - the displays are amazing (photos to the right and below) and students love to tell me about what they are learning when I visit.

Many classes have visited the Blue Lake in Rotorua as part of their learning. It's great to see our students getting out of the classroom to get a real context for what they are learning about. Thank you to all whanau who helped with transport to Rotorua and back. We really appreciate your support.











Last week, I spent two days with the other principals from our **Mount Maunganui Kāhui Ako**, Arohanoa from Ngāi Te Rangi Iwi and our two early childhood leaders. Our two days were focused around strategic planning for the future.

Arohanoa shared with us some amazing resources being developed by Ngāi Te Rangi to be used in our schools in the near future. Ngāi Te Rangi have used the metaphor of the pipi - one of the taonga of Tauranga Moanato help us to make connections to local stories and to build our knowledge and understanding of the significance of our beautiful whenua.

All principals commented on the benefits that working together provides for our students. The Kāhui Ako focuses on transitions between centres and schools, learning support clarity and collaboration, cultural identity and developing consistent assessment practices. Although our schools all have their own unique flavour, it is great that we collaborate so well for the educational benefit of our young people.

Last night, we had the **MMI 2022 Talent Quest** (some photos below) in our hall. I was asked by Mrs Mackenzie to be a judge and it was such a hard job!! Our students are so talented and having the confidence to stand on the stage and share your talents is something that all participants should feel very proud of. I am certainly proud of you all. Thank you to Mrs Mackenzie for all your hard work in getting this event off the ground for our students. It was neat to see the audience enjoying the talent of our Mounties.

## MAUAO ATHLETE PATHWAYS (MAP) APPLICATION 2023

MAP is a sporting and academic support network that will help students' achieve their curriculum and sporting ambitions. Over time, with the aid of teachers, coaches and regional sporting organisations, MAP students will receive the necessary support to achieve their goals at school and beyond. MAP students will receive wrap-around mentoring and academic guidance towards desired educational and sporting aspirations through the aid of tertiary pathways and our American scholarship partner 'Kiwi Athlete Agency'.

Next year Mauao Athlete Pathways (MAP) will run as an option subject but students would not have been able to select it as one of their options as they will have had to trial first. So we would like to share or remind them that if they want to have MAP as one of their options, they have to register on our school website by the 29th of October, then they need to come to the trial on Friday Nov 4th, 9am-2:15pm.




## **RĀ WHAKANGAHAU**
