#### Kia ora Parents and Whānau

I hope you have all had a great week. It's been great to be able to enjoy the summer weather and to see the students enjoying our awesome outdoor facilities.

#### **Strategic Direction 2023**

As you will be aware, we have been working on a change in direction around how we cater for and extend our academically capable learners at MMI. This year will be the last year we will run our full accelerate classes, with 2022's year 7 accelerate students, being joined by a mainstream group of classmates in 2023. This transition period allows for students in the accelerate programme, to complete this in 2023.

#### **Extension Opportunities in 2023**

In 2023, mainstream classes will continue to cater for all learners, providing programmes and learning opportunities at their individual academic level. All classes at MMI have very capable learners and as always, we will differentiate the curriculum to cater for all students in all of our classrooms.

When planning inquiry units, or series of lessons in reading, writing and maths, teachers at MMI will consider both level four as well as level five achievement objectives for extension opportunities. Our scope and sequence documents will continue to provide clarity for all staff about what level five concepts require and look like for those who are working at this level.

In 2023, we will launch our "MMI Academic Academies". These academies will run in each of the four terms, for 8-week blocks and will be run in blocks one and two on a Friday. During block one, three academies will be available to students. During block two, two further academies will be available to students in addition to the extension programme which will also be offered by our 6 specialist teachers.

The Board of Trustees had budgeted for extra staffing to allow staff to run these programmes. The extension classes will be limited to literacy, numeracy, science and thinking skills with a challenging academic focus. Each class will run for 8-weeks and they will be taught by a variety of passionate and capable MMI teachers.

Selection for these classes will be based on classroom data through our in-school assessments. Teachers will be asked for student data and the senior leadership team will make the final selections. Attendance will be optional - if a student would prefer to remain in their own classes, that will be up to them.

Students may attend more than one extension class over the year. We think that having access to a variety of teachers who will be teaching an area they are passionate about and interested in themselves, is a great segway into high school. The senior leadership team (Whaea Debbie, Mr Banbury, Mrs Thurston and myself) will also teach one class each - so each term there will be a senior leader teaching in the first block each Friday.

Our academy classes will also report to parents about what the students are learning in each class and their results/progress within the class.

In addition to our MMI Academic Academies, we will continue to offer other opportunities for extension such as ICAS testing, Otago Problem Solving, science fair, future problem solving, writing competitions, speech competitions etc.

2023 will be an exciting year where we will capitalise on the strengths of our staff to offer some excellent opportunities for extension outside of our classroom programmes. We will learn as we go and iron out any logistical issues as they arise.

#### **Electives**

In 2023, each team will run enrichment opportunities for all students. These will take place every second Friday afternoon. At MMI, we have assemblies every second week, so our enrichment programme will run on alternative weeks to our assemblies. Each team will plan and offer four enrichment opportunities within their team for five afternoons each term. Students will have some options and will be taught by a teacher in their house for the five sessions.

Teachers will use student voice and their own skills, strengths and passions to offer opportunities for learning outside of the core curriculum. The driver here is to provide engaging, interesting, motivating, fun learning opportunities and to expose the students to new skills, new teachers and new classmates. There may be opportunities for whānau to join teachers during these sessions to share their skills and strengths. We love the idea of opening our doors to our community and creating opportunities for our students to learn from other adults in our MMI whānau.

#### Mount Maunganui Rā Whakangahau

Yesterday, our contributing schools, as well as Mount College, joined us for a celebration and performance of kapa haka. It was so cool to have our contributing schools come to our kura to share their talent and creativity. We enjoyed welcoming lots of supporters and whānau who joined their respective kapa haka roopu to awhi and support them in their performances.

We saw such mana and talent in every performance. Our own kapa haka group performed beautifully and it was great to show our manuhiri what they can aspire to be when it is their turn to come to MMI as year 7s and year 8's.
