Mental Health Programme in 2023

We are hugely grateful for having been gifted this amazing programme to support our students as they navigate adolescence and the associated challenges around mental health. Rachelle Hawes has developed this daily programme that will support students in their everyday lives to celebrate successes, navigate challenges, develop resilience, make healthy choices and establish positive relationships with their peers. There will be more information about this programme next year, but I would like to acknowledge and thank Rachelle for her generous support.

Mental Wellbeing is not only vital for students' success during their school years, but also for their future paths as they navigate their way in the world. Children who are well-equipped with Positive Mindset Tools are far more likely to learn and perform at their best, now and in the future, and are far less likely to fall into depression during their Teenage years and beyond.

Science has proven over and over again that when children (and adults) are feeling happy, their memory is significantly improved, they are more productive, more creative, more motivated, more engaged and are much more likely to find careers they love and can excel in - increasing their chances of living a longer and happier life.

We all want our kids to be happy, healthy kids who enjoy life and are well equipped with the tools they need to face and overcome the challenges ahead of them.

This program ticks all the boxes – it is an investment in their today, their tomorrow and their future.

Reflection on 2022

2022 has been a positive and productive year at Mount Maunganui Intermediate. As I reflect on the year, it is clear that we have achieved a lot in a year filled with ongoing challenges in a COVID world and the associated challenges with attendance, anxiety and an ever-changing landscape.

We have had a large number of pivotal staffing changes and I have to say that all of the new staff have made amazing contributions to the school as a whole.

Of note, is our fantastic new(ish) office team. Leonie, Mel and Karen are a phenomenal team who have not only picked up and run with the many systems and structures in the office quickly and efficiently, but have also adapted, changed and developed systems to make the office run even better than before. I am hugely grateful for their can-do attitude, their professionalism and the welcoming, warm and professional service that greets visitors to our school.



2022 also saw a relatively new SLT around the leadership table. Again, I feel privileged to work with such a hardworking, dedicated, innovative and passionate group of leaders. At all times, I feel supported in my role and very appreciative at the high levels of relational trust amongst us. I admire the work ethic and work output of Debbie, Shem and Renee and am grateful to feel absolutely confident in their decision making as deputy principals. I also appreciate their sense of fun - the banter and the laughs we enjoy daily and how kids are always the lens that we challenge each other to look through when making the tough calls. Our SLT are highly skilled and knowledgeable professionals and our school is very fortunate to have all of them leading the way.

I am proud of the many things we have achieved in 2022.

• We have a new vision, motto and values that has been constructed by all stakeholders and that reflects who we are and what is important to us.

- We have a new strategic plan that will guide our direction and development over the next three years. The strategic plan is cohesive, fit for purpose, relevant and has students and staff at the centre.
- Our attendance rates have steadily improved and are better than most other primary and intermediate schools in our region.
- We have two new classrooms and six more to come in the next year. Our BOT approved the building of a shade cover on our turf and this should be completed in 2023.
- We refurbished the staffroom, giving our valuable staff a fit-for-purpose place to meet and relax in.
- We held the inaugural cultural camps here in Tauranga Moana which were really successful and well received by the students.
- We held the first school production at MMI in many years. This will become a regular feature in the future as we grow opportunities for our students in the Arts.
- We have planned an innovative programme for extension and enrichment that will cater for a broad range of students next year.
- Our international students programme is being rebuilt and revamped with promising numbers of students starting the year in 2023.
- Our staff continue to be leaders in our Kahui Ako, with our school being the only school with more than one Across School Leader roles (MMI has three).
- The hauora and mental health of our students continues to be a focus for us. Harriet and Tania do an excellent job in liaising with the many resources and agencies that support our students. The support services we provide are robust and successful.
- The Youth Lives Matter organisation donated nearly \$90,000 to us after a phenomenal and very humbling fundraising effort. As a result, we can pay for a councillor for two years and can also employ MMIs first official Youth Mentor (full time) in 2023.
- Financially the school is sound, with this year's surplus contributing to a positive financial position moving forward.
- We have a great new Board and a boardroom to have our meetings in :-)
- We have established PLGs with the other intermediate deputy principals and this group meets twice per term to share practice, ideas, challenges and celebrations. This network is affirming for us as well as being a great source of support and new ideas.
- We have automated our class placement procedures through a new programme called Pluto.

There are many other celebrations, some of which I have forgotten. I am incredibly proud to be leading such a fantastic school. I absolutely love my job - and this is mainly because of the team of people I am privileged to lead and the cool kids that come to our school every day to inspire us all to be the best versions of ourselves as educators.

Finally - thank you to our phenomenal teaching and support staff team. Students at MMI are taught and supported by the most amazing group of professionals. I thank you all for your dedication, hard work, professionalism, talent and for your commitment to the kids we all come to work for.

Merry Christmas to all our MMI whānau. Thank you for your ongoing support of our kura. I hope your holidays are filled with family time and that the summer of 2022-2023 creates lots of new and fun memories with family and friends.
