Kia ora Parents and Whanau

It has been another great (short) week at MMI. Students have been focussed and busy, both in and out of the classroom.

Our trips to the Ballance Agri Nutrient Factory began this week, with classes visiting Ballance on a bus to learn more about chemical and physical change in this local context. During their visit, students will gain a better understanding of the processes that take place at the factory. Upon their return to class, students will apply their new knowledge to class competition about plant growth.



In term three, our inquiry will examine the notion of Power- who holds the power and how do they use it? Key understanding to be explored include:

- What is leadership?
- Characteristics of leaders
- How leadership impacts society
- Who can wield power to influence others?

Term 3's inquiry will encourage students to look at things through different perspectives. What one group in society values, may not be valued by another group.

Our Class Councillors and School Leaders have spent three days this week at Ngamuwahine Lodge with leaders from Tauranga Intermediate and Whakatane Intermediate. The students have undertaken many challenges during their three days including presenting a speech with no cue cards as well as getting to know a new bunch of people. We look forward to hearing more camp stories from them upon their return.

Don't forget that Learning Conferences are on Thursday 22 June. Please book in a slot to come to school to talk about your child's learning. Our specialist staff are also available for appointments if you would like to talk about the specialist programme. Please note that Mrs Barr is away at the moment. What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals.

How to participate in ICAS

Please note that the ICAS tests shown for selection are at the school's discretion. After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records.

ICAS Results and Certificates

We will notify you of the date(s) that we run ICAS at the school and when your child's ICAS results are ready. Once we have received your child's ICAS certificate, we will send it home with your child. The back of the certificate shows ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin", that you and your child need to enter the Results Portal ortices assessments.com/ortiStudent

OUR HAPPY PLACE

Students will be working through different sessions per week, with each session lasting around 10-15 minutes long. We will provide details about these sessions in our newsletter so you can support your child and follow these up at home.

The topics we are currently covering are:

SESSION 23 - THE BEST THINGS IN LIFE ARE FREE

This session is all about the great things in life that are free, like laughter shared with a friend, a wonderful hug or smile, being out in nature, the feeling of accomplishment when you achieve a goal or a good night's sleep!

Students are then encouraged to create their own list of things in their life they are grateful for which money can't buy.

SESSION 24 - POSITIVE AFFIRMATIONS

Session 24 looks at the things we can tell ourselves that are positive. Some examples discussed are, 'I am enough', 'I am a good friend', 'I learn from my mistakes' and 'I am getting better at...'.

Students then think about their own positive affirmations with the idea that our mind believes what you tell it, over and over again. So, by repeating new affirmations often and saying them with as much conviction and feeling as you can, you will convince your mind that they are true and therefore they will start to come true for you.

This is for the safety of your children, when dropping off or picking them up. Please refrain from entering and parking in these areas.


CHANGE OF DETAILS

BAY LINK UPDATE

Road closure at Bayfair roundabout to rebuild local road.

A small section of Maunganui Road between the Bayfair roundabout and Exeter Street is temporarily closing for reconstruction of the ground level road as part of the Bay Link project.

From early morning Wednesday 7 June 2023 this section of road will be closed until early spring, weather dependent, and a detour for people travelling locally will be in place. Following the full closure, the road will then be open but reduced to one lane until late spring to enable completion of footpaths, driveways and other elements.

The new Bayfair flyover won't be impacted by this closure and continue to provide for most traffic travelling on SH2 between Mount Maunganui and Tauranga Eastern Link (TEL)/Pāpāmoa, and SH29A/Maungatapu.

We encourage all road users to allow extra time, share the roads with care and patience, and follow directions.

Closing this road is the next step in a carefully sequenced programme. It's only possible now that the flyover has opened, under temporary traffic management, and subsequently reduced traffic on ground level roads.

People have embraced the new flyover and new travel patterns have settled in. This means, especially at peak time, traffic on local roads has been reduced with people using the flyover for their travels, allowing us to close a section of the ground level road. Closing it allows work to progress more efficiently than it would with a single lane closure.

DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE A WIGGLY TOOTH?

Your child losing their first tooth is a rite of passage and usually happens at around six years of age. The tooth comes loose then falls out, leaving a gap for the adult tooth.

This continues up until age 12, when all the baby teeth have usually fallen out.

It is okay to have your children wiggle and [for you to] wobble their teeth to help them come out. Just make sure you have clean hands and just try and grab it and gently wiggle it. Over a few days to a week or two it will come out.

After your child's tooth falls out, the gum area may be a little tender and sore.

It's still important to keep up tooth brushing and oral hygiene. Follow these five tips for a healthy smile.

- Brush twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste.
- Have regular dental check-ups.
- Lift the lip every month and check your child's teeth and gums.
- Choose healthy snacks.
- Drink water or milk.
