Next year, our school roll will be bigger than this year as the number of year 6's in our contributing schools is slightly larger than usual.

Vaping:

We have had a concerning number of students caught vaping at school in recent weeks. Whilst in the scheme of things, it is a very small percentage of our school population, we are very concerned about the choice that too many young people are making around vaping.

We take vaping very seriously, for the following reasons:

- Vaping is illegal for all children under the age of 18.
- Vaping is harmful to the developing brain. The long term effects of vaping are still unknown and we believe vaping is detrimental to the health and safety of young people.
- Vaping is a harmful and dangerous example to others. It reflects poorly on the student and on our school.

At Mount Maunganui Intermediate, the following consequences will be given to students if they are caught vaping:

First offence: One day internal stand down (participated in vaping) or a two day internal stand down (also provided the vape). The student will be removed from their classroom for the day(s) and will not have breaks at normal break times. They will be supervised to complete a work booklet involving educational activities about the effects of vaping. Parents will be contacted by phone and/or email.

If a child decides to vape again, this would be considered their second offence.

Second offence: Two days, official stand down. This stand down is communicated to the Ministry of Education and remains on the student's record for the duration of their schooling. The student will be unable to attend school for two days. A reintegration meeting will be held at school, attended by a parent(s) before the student can return to class. Should the number of stand downs exceed Ministry of Education guidelines (per term or per year), the child may be suspended from school.

How can you support us?

- If you know or suspect that your child may be vaping, please check their bag and uniform before they come to school. Do not give them money or access to make purchases on their way to or from school.
- Talk with them about why vaping is bad for them. Even if there are adult smokers or vapers in your home, they are adults. Vaping is illegal for children for good reason.
- Support the consequences given at school.

Most incidents of vaping have occurred in our changing rooms or toilets - which are of course not covered by our cameras. We have spoken with students this week about not going into the changing room in groups or for any other reason than to get changed. We have also said that if more than one person is seen in a toilet cubicle together, we will assume that they are vaping and consequences will be given.

As a school, we are doing everything we can think of to both deter and respond to vaping. We have stepped up supervision and checks around the toilet areas of the grounds and have systems in place when students need to leave class to use the toilets.

Thank you for supporting us with this frustrating battle. We are not alone as a school facing challenges around vaping, but we are committed to doing everything we can to ensure MMI is a safe and healthy place for students to attend and thrive in.

Huge thanks to our PSG volunteers and staff for giving up their time to hold a fantastic social occasion for our students last night. The "S" theme saw the creativity of our kids shine and their dance moves were epic. The PSG are contributing the money they raise to many school wide projects that benefit all students and provide the little extras that our school budget does not stretch to. We are hugely grateful for their support.






BOP TABLE TENNIS TOURNAMENT

DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE A WIGGLY TOOTH?

Your child losing their first tooth is a rite of passage and usually happens at around six years of age. The tooth comes loose then falls out, leaving a gap for the adult tooth.

This continues up until age 12, when all the baby teeth have usually fallen out.

It is okay to have your children wiggle and (for you to) wobble their teeth to help them come out. Just make sure you have clean hands and just try and grab it and gently wiggle it. Over a few days to a week or two it will come out.

After your child's tooth falls out, the gum area may be a little tender and sore.

It's still important to keep up tooth brushing and oral hygiene. Follow these five tips for a healthy smile.

- Brush twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste.
- Have regular dental check-ups.
- Lift the lip every month and check your child's teeth and gums.
- Choose healthy snacks.
- Drink water or milk.


