In collaboration with our bus operators, we are launching a student education initiative, starting with a "Code of Conduct" which will be displayed on every bus.

Please see attached a letter outlining what is expected from school students when using the bus service, along with a copy of the "Code of Conduct" poster which will be displayed in every bus.

Code of Conduct

We want all of our buses to be friendly, safe, and inclusive for everyone. To achieve this, we ask you to take responsibility for your own behaviour.

You have the right to:

- Be treated with respect
- Receive friendly and courteous service
- A safe, clean and comfortable travelling environment

This means that you will not:

- Threaten, bully or harass other people on the bus
- Swear or use bad language
- Eat, drink, vape or smoke on the bus
- Tag, graffiti or damage the bus in any way
- Exhibit anti-social or disorderly behaviour

You are responsible for:

- Respecting other peoples' rights
- Paying the correct fare
- Following any reasonable instructions from the driver and/or another company representative
- Good behaviour
- Telling us if you see anyone damaging the bus

Please follow this Code of Conduct so everyone can have a pleasant journey. If you don't comply with the Code of Conduct, it may result in removal of your right to use the bus and/or prosecution for unlawful behaviour.

We can't wait to see what the future holds for this extraordinary team.



Intermediate Bike Safety 2024

Travel Safe in partnership with Intermediate Schools would like to invite 2024 Year 7/8 students to register for Intermediate Bike Safety 2024.

This is a bike safety programme that is designed to encourage and support intermediate students to safely ride their bikes to and from school, building skills and confidence on the road.

Students will learn how to safely navigate intersections and identify hazards. The programme supports the local bike infrastructure, students' own decision making around route choice, and school's bike procedures.

We have a refreshed programme to make this more accessible to students.

This is achieved by having set outcomes that are specific to the infrastructure around the school and surrounding streets.

The session timings will allow students and instructors to have more time to discuss, demonstrate and do the learning outcomes. This will help the students get a better understanding and increased confidence.

This approach will also ensure that all students get consistent bike safety instruction, regardless of where they live and their route to school. This programme will now be completed in school hours.






Underwater hockey is a sport consisting of 2 teams of up to 10 players, 6 playing and 4 subs contesting a puck weighing approx 1.2kg. Each team aims to put the puck into their opponents goal. 1 team will play with black sticks and the other white sticks which are used to push the puck along the bottom of the pool. Players use fins for speed through the water, a mask and snorkle to enable the players to keep an eye on the game. They also wear a glove and cap for protection.
