Sharing our Progress and Achievement:

Rational Numbers and Financial Literacy - Term 3, 2025.

The Mathematics focus for Term 3 was on 'Rational Numbers (fractions, decimals and percentages) and financial literacy'. Students completed a snapshot at the beginning of the term. This information enabled teachers to find aspects that they could target during the teaching and learning for the term. We then completed a similar snapshot to see how much progress each student had made. We were very pleased with the significant progress made by our students.

As a staff, we intentionally focus on using data to inform our teaching. We use this data to further identify areas that we need to focus on to ensure our learners reach their potential.

In term 4 we will have a whole school focus on Algebra and we look forward to seeing the progress that students will undoubtedly make during this unit of work.

STUDENT ONLINE SAFETY WITH SECURITY

We are excited to tell you about a new tool we're using to keep our students safe and focused during the school day.

Last term, we rolled our Securly Classroom across the school ICT network to help manage our 1:1 Chromebook program. Securly lets us see in real time what our students are viewing and doing on their devices, ensuring they stay on task and use their technology responsibly. This includes visibility into all sites students are accessing.

A key part of this programme is the ability for our staff to monitor activity and manage device access in real time, which helps maintain a focused learning environment. So far, the feedback from staff has been really positive.

Today, during assembly, I shared the features of Securly with our students and highlighted exactly what our staff can see and do. As a result, all students are now fully aware of the capabilities that our staff and ICT Department have to support a safe online learning experience.


