We are excited to share that we have successfully moved to the **Hero Student Management System**.

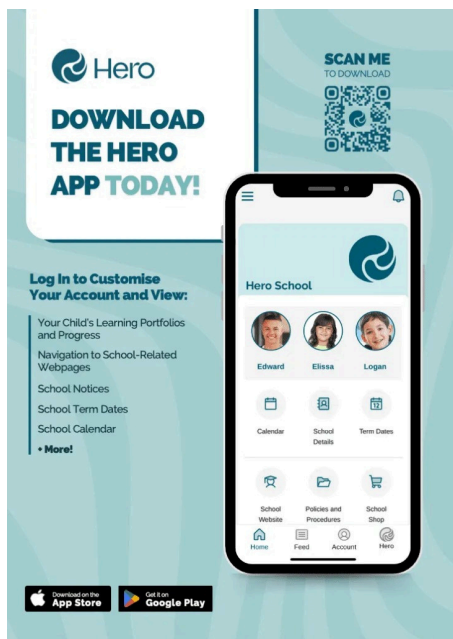
Hero is a secure, all-in-one platform designed to simplify school communication and bring your child's learning journey to life.

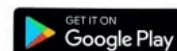

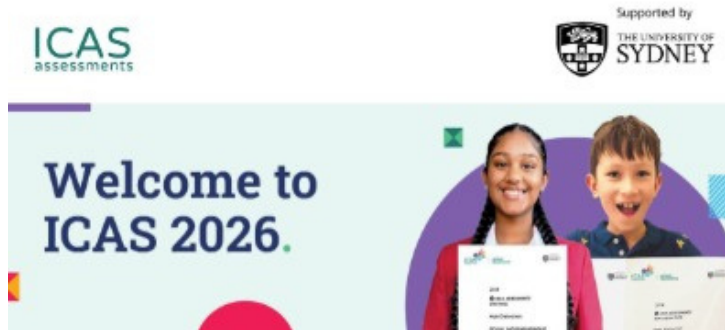

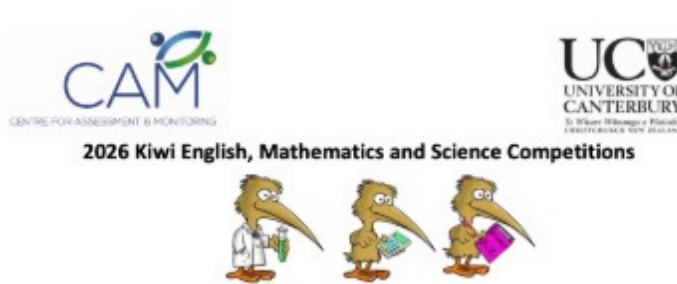

Together, we hope we can keep PIPS alive for our tamariki and future generations.

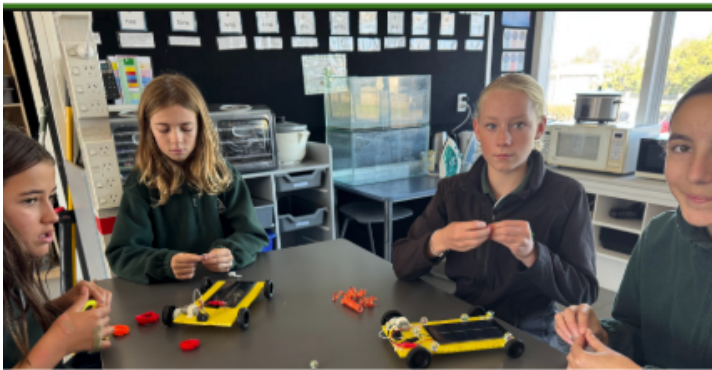
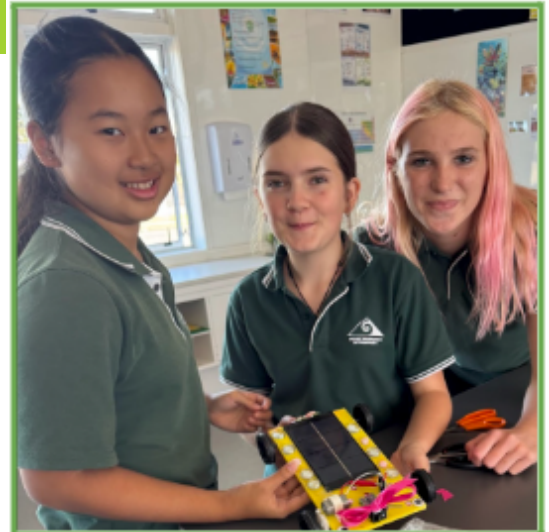
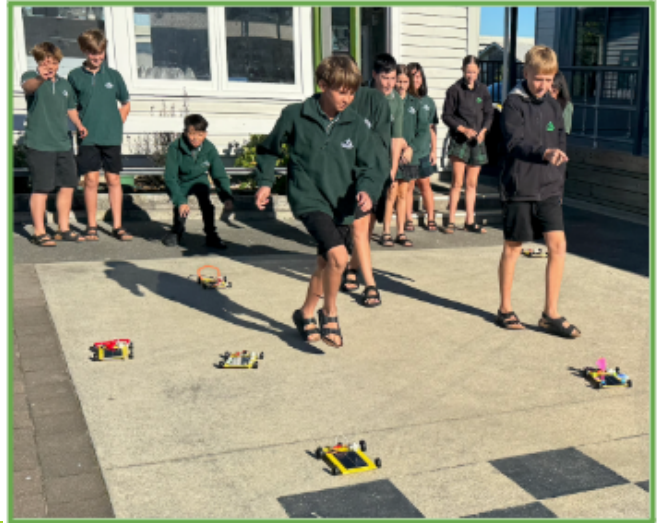
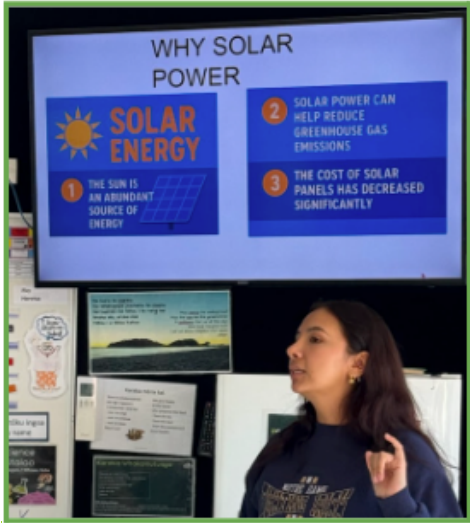

MMI update regarding AIMS 2026

We would like to provide you with an update regarding AIMS 2026.

All team codes have now been confirmed, and consent forms for team sports are required to be returned by Monday 26 May. Thank you to those who have already completed these.

Individual sports (codes) are currently being finalised, and consent forms for these events will be sent out later this week if you have not already received one.

AIMS Green Team Environmental Group 2026

AIMS Green Team expressions of interest will also open this week via the Google Form.

The AIMS Games Green Team is a dedicated group of Intermediate school students who volunteer at the annual Zespri AIMS Games in Tauranga, New Zealand. Working alongside local environmental organisations, students help lead waste management efforts, manage recycling and composting stations, and educate thousands of athletes and spectators on environmental sustainability.

This year at MMI, if your child wishes to compete in more than one sporting code, they will need to complete an exemption form. The MMI AIMS Committee will then meet to review whether this is a viable option and will inform you within a week of submission.

Please note that MMI has made a change to its approach regarding students competing in multiple sports. We are tightening this process to ensure that teams are not left with insufficient player numbers and to help prevent athlete burnout.

Team sports must take precedence. Students need to be fully available and committed to their team event for the duration of AIMS. For example, if there is a hockey game that clashes with rock climbing, hockey will take precedence.

No refund will be given if clashes between event times occur and a student is unable to attend events as a result of scheduling overlaps.

The following information is also outlined on the AIMS website:

“Please note: No timetable adjustments will be made to accommodate scheduling conflicts between sporting codes. It is the responsibility of each school and the parent/caregivers to ensure that students’ chosen events do not overlap.”
